Dear Judy and the Far North Queensland Youth Assistance Fund Committee,

My name is Doreen. I live with my daughter, Emma, in Edmonton. Emma had a stroke during birth and now lives with Cerebral Palsy. To provide her with the basic early intervention therapies I have been fundraising and advocating for better support for children with physical disabilities since.

In 2016 I contacted the FNQYAF requesting assistance with a significant fundraiser which I was unable to administer on my own. At the time I was burnt-out and struggled to cope with the challenges of being a special needs mum, therapist, advocate and fundraising manager all at once.
